#### KIMMI in Brief

- **Aim-** The integration of fixed route conventional public bus services with flexible, demand responsive transport (DRT) community-focused modes.
- Area- County Kilkenny, Ireland; population of approx. 100,000'; rural county with one large town and numerous small towns and villages.
- Approach- The use of 'real time passenger information' (RTPI) hardware and software to link national bus carrier- JJ Kavanagh Coaches and community transport company Ring a Link.









#### Why, When, What, How?



- KLP, founded in 1991 is a 'LEADER company': a local NGO focused on broad-based rural development;
- Identified poor transport/ mobility, as key source of disadvantage of rural communities and businesses- and realised that public policy was inadequate to the challenge
- Mentored the formation of community-based transport company; Ring a Link, in 2001. Now the biggest & best in Ireland of its type.
- KLP continued mobility focus over the years- and in the last few moved to plan for a future of integrated options.
- Instigated and led a number of actions to build a consensus, enlarge capacity and form partnerships and coalitions to tackle the work.













### Kilkenny's Other Mobility Initiatives Involvement

• **SAMPO-** 1995- '97: The main goal of SAMPO was to assess and demonstrate the value added potential and the effectiveness of telematics technologies to provide Demand Responsive Transport Services (DRTS).



 SAMPLUS- late 90's, following on from the successful SAMPO project, it demonstrated and evaluated Demand Responsive Transport (DRT) services using telematics technologies.



 SUNRISE- 2004-'06: transfer the technological, operational and organisational experiences of DRT services to allow regional development in transport services and improve the social cohesion; Ring a Link was the local partner



 FLIPPER- 2008- '09: aimed at establishing a knowledge transfer network among different EU areas and Authorities, to achieve capability-building, environmental, sustainable and innovative solutions in Public Transport; Ring a LinK was the local partner





### Planning, Consensus & Capacity Building

- KLP hosted a public 'Think Tank' on mobility and transport in Kilkenny, November 2016.
- KLP with partners Ring a Link, Local Energy Agency, organised and funded the international iROUTE Conference in June 2017. designed:
  - Stimulate new thinking around public transport
  - New networks, plans and projects
- iROUTE led to the formation of the Kilkenny Integrated Transport Group (KITG) to plan for above,
  - KLP, RaL, Local Authority, Energy Agency, business
  - KTIG commissioned the Comprehensive Mobility Plan (CMP)
  - CMP and KTIG made KIMMI possible...

- TICK: 'Transport in Cairngorms & Kilkenny'- a LEADER Cooperation project with our LEADER colleagues in Scotland.
- Focused on integrated transport options,
- KTIG partner visit in March 2019.
  Important in building a partnership internally and externally
- Commenced in 2019, due to finish
  2021

#### Transport Context in Ireland

- National Transport Authority (NTA) has high-level responsibility for policy.
- However little focus to date on rural transport- and even less on integration of local services.
- KIMMI partners met with NTA and briefed them on proposal: NTA agreed to take a 'watching brief' on the initiative.
- KIMMI partners hope that it can provide a model for replication elsewhere in the region- and potentially the country...












#### Kilkenny in Context















#### Kilkenny: A Brief Profile

- County population of 100,000 with Kilkenny City 26,500 of that total.
- Economy- Agriculture, food processing, tourism, light engineering, creative sector, financial administration...
- Other than the 'City'- small towns and villages, dispersed in rolling pastoral landscape, river valleys and low hills.
- Tourism focused on City culture and a few rural attractions. Lots of potential in 'heritage tourism': e.g. The Lingaun Valley
- Reasonable road system- M8 and M9 motorways; On railway link to Dublin and Waterford. A lot of minor roads...



















# The Link to The Lingaun Valley

### Target Audience & Additional Mobility Mode

Initial focus on independent travellers ("the culturally curious") staying in Kilkenny 15 hotels.

Hoping also to benefit rural residents with 'back-haul' mobility option to Kilkenny or Clonmel.

To support/ attract visitors, KIMMI will also trial small bike hire option at the Lingaun Super Stop on that route: 2 X electric bikes and 4 push bikes.

If successful, this option could be replicated in all of the Super Stops in the other rural villages.












### Beyond the Pilot...

- Implement integrated RTPI service in main villages linked to the city- and link to wider region.
  - Recruit other smaller private operators to partner on project to get complete 'county coverage'.
  - Link Waterford- Kilkenny and Waterford-Clonmel as a 'triangle model'
  - Replicate and expand on that model elsewhere in the near region- Clonmel, Carlow, Portlaoise, New Ross. Forming an integration matrix of modes.
