
Rural shared mobility landscape

Asset sharing

Allows the traveller to utilise/pickup a specific means of transport (bike, car, e-scooter, etc.) without any property issue; users must be registered.



The 'shared mobility services' include both the **mobility services** themselves and the **supporting services** including traveler information, reservation, payment and operation management.



Flexible Transport Services

Include a range of services that act as an additional layer between conventional (fixed route and schedule based) transport and personal transport (car or taxi)


Ride sharing

Allows aggregation of the mobility demand for sharing a ride in the same vehicle (e.g. carpooling); and/or to use the same service (e.g. taxi) together with other persons










Introducing the Network of Rural Mobility Sites working with SMARTA/SMARTA2







The Role of Pilots, how we learn from them, and the importance of sharing experience among Pilots

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Purpose of Pilots and how we learn from them

- Implement a service, improve mobility
- Test service concepts, technology, operations
- Trial and improve methods learning by doing

What may be the stated purpose of a Pilot?

- Test and understand potential customer response
- Test/validate expectations about usage, costs, support requirements
- Learn about impacts (social, environmental, ...)

- Enable Stakeholders to understand concepts and their relevance
- Gain buy-in and support from stakeholders, including operators
- Gain buy-in and support fron communities and user group
- "Wayfinding" for a broader strategy and deployment plan

What else can be leveraged from a Pilot?

PILOT SITES

How do we learn from Pilots?

- Measurement of various quantitative and qualitative indicators
- Interviews/debrief with users, implementers and sponsors
- Discussions with stakeholders
- Comparing actual outcomes
 with original expectations
 - Analysis of achievements and problems; using the experience gained
 - Sharing experience and learning from other pilots

An Implementation project can also serve as a Pilot/Demonstrator, by developing an evaluation plan and assigning some resources








Scope of the SMARTA Evaluation Framework

Research questions:

What are the solutions to cope with rural mobility challenges?

What would be the impacts of implementing such solutions?

What can policymakers, institutions and system managers do to improve rural mobility?







Benefits of sharing experience among Pilots

Networking

- Work with and learn from peers
- Access to information not easily available, especially for smaller or rural agencies
- Build relationships, can follow-up with bilateral working and visits

Problem-solving

- Dealing with institutional, regulatory and organisational barriers
- Dealing with technical and operational issues and challenges

Learning

- New ideas, techniques, technologies
- Methods to improve efficiency and effectiveness
- Ridership, revenues, costs, take-up rates and learning curve
- Marketing, communication and customer outreach

Convincing

- Gather evidence to convince stakeholders, influencers and sceptics
- Position your local pilot within a European and global context


