What is MAMBA?


MAMBA is about maximizing mobility and accessibility of services in rural regions.

It is a project under the Interreg Baltic Sea Region Program that runs from October 2017 until September 2020.

It includes 15 partners from six countries: Denmark, Germany, Poland, Latvia, Finland and Sweden.

MAMBA has a budget of 3.54 million EUR.



The Pilot area: Smidstrup/Skærup



This is Smidstrup/Skærup

- There is a population of 780 inhabitants
- They have a school, kindergarten and a sports club.
- They have one bus that drives through town 4 times a day. Two in the morning and two in the afternoon and the last bus leave Vejle at 16:00
- There is no train.
- In a car there is:

Vejle: 13 min

Fredericia: 14 min


Kolding: 20 min

The pilot and Mobility center is a ridesharing app with a full connection to our national Travel Planner.



Where did we start?

We started with a survey





Then we talked with the local council and the local citizens

The NaboGO concept


- Ride sharing as part of public transportation

Business model

NaboGO sells mobility solutions to municipalities and traffic companies

Teknique

- · Combination trips
- Pre-defined meeting points
- Minimum of daily coordination
- · Automatic price setting and payment
- · No user fee





What has happened during the project period

Users: 4.500 No. Of Municipalities: 25

Offered rides: 150.000 No of Regions: 2

Requested rides: 50.000 No of Traffic companies: 2

Successful trips: 1.000 No of countries: 2



Conclusion

There is an extreme interest from the public partners to make Ridesharing a part of the public transportation system.

It is much easier to convince people to offer a ride, than it is to increase demand and actually get people to take a Ride.

This is a major change process that will take a long time and a lot of work to complete



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
