On **Friday, 11th December**, two specific sessions will be organised in the morning, both dealing with impacts, evaluation and ways forward. The second session will introduce the broader perspective on rural mobility, including future opportunities, addressing issues, such as community building, environment and traffic, including a session on the COVID-19 outbreak and its implication on rural mobility.


